III. RATIONALE Provide the justification for the proposed amendment. Explain why your proposed amendment should be adopted.

Clubs from both KSYSA and MYSO both participate in Heartland Soccer League, but the maximum roster size is not equal for both states. Clubs in Kansas are only allowed to roster 12 players (while Missouri clubs can roster 14). For clubs from Kansas to increase their game day rosters while participating in Heartland league, clubs must fill out guest player paperwork weekly. This can be eliminated and decrease workloads for clubs by affording Kansas clubs a maximum roster of 14 players for 7v7 age groups. This minor rule change streamlines both state associations maximum roster policies and deletes the need for weekly paperwork for clubs to submit.
