

FAQ for Competitive Players & Parents

When are tryouts for the 2025-2026 season?

- Physical Tryouts can begin no earlier than June 6, 2025.
- Clubs may open registration for tryouts at any time before that date.

What is Signing Day, and when is it?

Signing Day is the first official date that players can accept an offer to join a team for the upcoming season.

- **April 1, 2025** Players can re-sign with their **current club team** and pay a deposit to secure their spot without going through a tryout.
- May 27, 2025 Players may sign with any club (including new clubs) without attending a physical tryout if they participated in a properly advertised "ID Event."

What is a formal acceptance?

- A formal acceptance can include a written or electronic signature, contract, or financial deposit.
- Once accepted, the player is bound to that club for the upcoming seasonal year unless:
 - o The player rescinds their acceptance within the allowed timeframe.
 - o A Release Transfer Request Form is submitted and approved.

Can I rescind my commitment after I sign?

- Yes, players have 72 hours from the time of their acceptance to rescind their commitment without penalty.
- If you rescind within this period, your **full deposit will be refunded**.

How do I stay with my current club team?

Players can re-sign with their current club team starting April 1, 2025.

How can I explore other club options?

• Players can attend **Player Identification Events** (such as camps, clinics, or kickarounds) at any time before tryouts without needing to request a release.

What is a Player Identification Event?

- An event such as a camp, clinic, or kickaround that is properly advertised and open to all players wishing to attend.
- Attending one of these events allows you to sign with that club starting **May 27, 2025**, without participating in a physical tryout.

When can clubs start communicating with players about tryouts?

• Clubs may begin advertising and opening registration for tryouts starting **January 1, 2025**.
